

AMESSAGE MEROM Delegral As we approach the winter and holiday season, I want to express my gratitude for all that our families and community do to support our Baxter Schools. We have transitioned from our fall activities into a busy schedule of winter activities, and I am extremely impressed by how involved our students are in everything from athletics to the fine arts. I am a firm believer that our students benefit from participating in a wide variety of experiences

As we enter the winter months, I want to just remind all of our families on our procedures involving winter weather. As a district, our goal is to have any decision made by 6:00 AM at the latest. We will communicate all closings, early outs, and delays through a variety of sources that include JMC, the district Facebook page, and the following television stations: WHOTV 13 and KCCI. If we have an early out due to weather, there will be no afternoon or evening activities. If we have a late start due to weather, there will be no morning activities. This pertains to all grades PK-12th. Students safety will always be at the forefront of the decision making process, and the district will err on the side of caution in winter weather situations.

On the academic side of things, the state recently released the Iowa School Performance Profile. This measures district performance on a number of measures including proficiency on the ISASP, growth on the ISASP, attendance rate and growth, graduation rates, and postsecondary readiness rates. I am happy to say that both of our buildings scored in the *Commendable* range, with the elementary and secondary scoring 5-6% above the state average. I am hopeful our students and families will have a relaxing and energizing winter break. On that same note, a reminder that school will dismiss at 1:00 PM on Friday, December 20th for winter break and school will resume for students on Monday, January 6th at 9:00 AM. We will also have no school for students on Monday, January 20th, as our teachers have a full day of professional learning planned.

As I have transitioned to Baxter, the overall support and drive of our students, families and staff continues to amaze me on a daily basis. There have been many good times, but also challenging scenarios from time to time as well. Thank you all for encouraging and pushing me to be the best version of myself in this role. I am extremely grateful to be at Baxter Secondary!

With that said, there are always tweaks and adjustments that need to be considered. Two big items that continue to be discussed in the secondary building are moving toward a collective behavior framework that all staff agree upon and follow in the classroom as well as having a hallway management system to support all of our students. Our staff is exploring the **PROMPT** behavior management framework. This acronym stands for:

- P: Proximity Control
- R: Redirection Strategy
- OM: Ongoing Monitoring
- P: Prompt Expected Behavior
- T: Teaching Interaction

With any consideration of change, there comes an adjustment period. We will continue to look for ways to support all of our students and staff and more information will be forthcoming in the future around this work.

The second item I referenced is the pass system. This system would be electronic that would occur on the student devices when they would need to leave the classroom for the restroom, nurse, locker, etc. Students would be signed out and different configurations may be considered or implemented as a building to further ensure student safety. While I am not giving a lot of details in this regard, I do believe that we can further enhance our student learning by tightening a few things up as we progress.

Please don't read this the wrong way. Baxter is amazing and I feel that we are definitely trending in a positive direction, however, I just want to ensure that we continue to move the needle forward when it comes to our overall learning process.

CICS-"SUPPORTING INDIVIDUALS. STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES."

CICS supports 15 counties in Iowa and works to develop support for people with mental health concerns. You can reach Jasper County's service coordinator located in Newton at **641-841-1167**. CICS provides the following services as well as other services:

SERVICE COORDINATION: Each county has a Service Coordinator that can help you navigate services, apply for programs, and connect you with other resources that may be available.

CRISISLINE: Support on the telephone, anytime, day or night, for people looking for help with their emotions or mental health. **855-581-8111**

WARMLINE: A phone line staffed by individuals with lived experiences who provide non-judgemental, nondirective support to an individual experiencing stress and needing someone to talk to. **844-775-9276.**

MOBILE CRISIS RESPONSE: Teams of professionals provide on-site, mental health services for individuals or families experiencing a mental health crisis. They can respond wherever the crisis is occurring including where people live, work, attend school, or socialize. To access, call the Your Life Iowa Crisis Line 24/7 and request the mobile crisis team to be dispatched to your location. **855-581-8111**

COMMUNITY-BASEDCRISIS STABILIZATION: Short-term (5-Day) services designed to stabilize individuals experiencing a mental health crisis in the community by providing daily psychiatric services where people live, work, attend school or socialize.

RESIDENTIAL-BASEDCRISIS STABILIZATION: This service is similar to Community-Based Crisis Stabilization, but also provides a place to stay during a mental health crisis.

988-NATIONAL SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE: If you or someone you know is in crisis or simply doesn't know how to move forward, call or text 988.

TAKES IT ALLAT 2024 STATE DIVING!

After placing 5th at least year's state diving meet, Camryn was motivated and worked hard to increase the difficulty of the harder dives in her list and to clean up the lower difficulty dives. The increase in difficulty and honing her simpler dives resulted in higher judges scores and ultimately higher dive totals, where every hundredth of a point counts. That was clear in the results from the state meet, where Camryn edged out the second place diver, Kamila Swanson from lowa City West, by 1.35 points. Camryn also went undefeated this season throughout all her dual and invitational competitions! That is not a common occurrence, but was also a feat accomplished by her former teammate, Trista Thompson. Trista was the 2022 diving state champion and currently dives for the Panthers at UNI.

This season, we've worked on her front 1 1/2 pike, trying to adjust the path of her arms as she lines her arms up to enter the water to result in a cleaner, less splashy entry. Another dive we've spent significant attention on is her back 1 1/2 pike. The timing and direction of her kickout with her legs and also the path of her arms and the alignment of her body when she enters the water has been a little variable, so we've worked to make this more consistent so she can hit the dive more frequently.

In addition to increasing her dive difficulty, Camryn worked hard to become more comfortable at the end of the season by doing lots of repetitions of those harder dives, especially throughout the last month of the season. This was significant in her preparation for state. With such a short season, one of the really important factors in achieving end-of-season success is grinding through the beginning and middle of the season to gain more experience doing those harder dives in practice and also in competitions. If divers don't perform their dives often or at all in practice, it's much harder to perform them well in competition with the added pressure of performing by yourself in front of competitors, judges, and spectators. Camryn was mentally and physically prepared to perform all 11 dives at the end of the season without the stress of not having practiced her dives much. Doing a lot of repetitions in practice helped to prepare her to still perform dives well even if her approaches or take offs weren't ideal.

At the state meet, Camryn performed a very solid 11-dive list. She was led by as much as 15 points after round six, but was overtaken after Kamila performed a very good 9th round dive. Camryn slightly missed her 7th and 8th round dives to open the door. Camryn was trailing by five points after rounds nine and ten. Her last dive was a 5134D, front 1 1/2 somersault with 2 twists, a dive that she learned early this year. She competed this dive early in the season, but had some trouble with it. She decided to add it back into her list for regionals, and it was her highest scoring dive at the regional meet. Camryn had to hit this dive to have a chance of winning. Kamila performed the same dive with one less twist. This meant that Camryn was already at a degree of difficulty advantage by 0.4 points. Camryn dove before Kamila in the diving order. She hit the dive for 53.3 points! Then, we had to wait for Kamila to dive. Kamila needed to achieve more than 48.65 points, or 7.5s from the judges, to take the top position. Waiting for the scores seemed like an eternity! It was close, but she only received 47.3 points for her final dive. Looking at Camryn as the scores showed on the scoreboard, I don't think it resonated that she had actually won! It was an exciting moment to share with her!

I'm super proud of everything Camryn has achieved and the supportive teammate she is on the swim and dive team. It can be hard to join a team with people you don't know initially, but she's grown in many ways and is a positive leader, teammate, and athlete on our combined Grinnell-BGM-Baxter swim and dive team. I'm so glad I have the opportunity to coach Camryn and her teammates. I know she's a wonderful role model for the swimmers and divers in the Grinnell, BGM, and Baxter communities, but especially in the Baxter community. What a special leader to have for her peers and those younger than her

BAXTER COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT --- PARENT/GUARDIANNOTICE SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination against persons with a disability in any program receiving federal financial assistance. In order to fulfill obligations under Section 504, the Baxter Community School District has the responsibility to avoid discrimination in policies and practices regarding its personnel and students. No discrimination against any person with a disability should knowingly be permitted in any of the programs and practices of the school system.

The Baxter Community School District has the responsibilities under Section 504, which included the obligations to identify, evaluate, and, if the student is determined to be eligible under Section 504, to afford access to appropriate educational services.

If the parent/guardian disagrees with the determination made by the professional staff of the school district, he/she has a right to file a grievance and to a hearing with an impartial hearing officer.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) also specifies rights related to educational records. This Act gives the parent or guardian the right to:

1) Inspect and review his/her child's educational records; 2) Make copies of these records; 3) Receive a list of the individuals having access to those records; 4) Ask for an explanation of any item in the records; 5) Ask for an amendment to any report on the grounds that it is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the child's rights; and 6) A hearing on the issue if the school refuses to make the amendment.
